CBK CELEBRATES KENYA'S ELECTION TO THE UN SECURITY COUNCIL

The election will see Kenya sit on the Security Council for a two-year term beginning in 2021. This is particularly important in the current context of the COVID-19 pandemic. Kenya will have an opportunity to introduce the African perspective in this crucial global body.
