## RECENT MONETARY AND FINANCIAL DEVELOPMENTS

# **Exchange Rates**

The Kenya Shilling remained stable against major international and regional currencies during the week ending March 21. It exchanged at KSh 133.07 per US dollar on March 21, compared to KSh 137.49 per US dollar on March 14 (**Table 1**).

# **Foreign Exchange Reserves**

The usable foreign exchange reserves remained adequate at USD 7,022 million (3.7 months of import cover) as at March 21. This meets the CBK's statutory requirement to endeavor to maintain at least 4 months of import cover (Table 2).

# **Money Market**

Liquidity in the money market remained adequate during the week ending March 21, supported by open market operations. Commercial banks' excess reserves stood at KSh 23.3 billion in relation to the 4.25 percent cash reserves requirement (CRR). The average interbank rate was 13.53 percent on March 21 compared to 13.27 percent on March 14. During the week, the average number of interbank deals decreased to 41 from 44 in the previous week, while the average value traded increased to KSh 35.2 billion from KSh 29.8 billion in the previous week (**Table 3**).

#### **Government Securities Market**

The Treasury bills auction of March 21 received bids totaling KSh 24.7 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 24.0 billion, representing a performance of 102.8 percent. Interest rate on the 364-day Treasury bill remained stable, while the 91-day and 182-day rates increased marginally (Table 4).

During the Treasury bonds auction of March 20, the reopened 5-year and 10-year fixed rate Treasury bonds received bids totaling KSh 59.7 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 40.0 billion, representing a performance of 149.3 percent **(Table 5).** 

## **Equity Market**

At the Nairobi Securities Exchange, the NASI, NSE 25 and NSE 20 share price indices increased by 5.3 percent, 5.6 percent and 3.0 percent, respectively during the week ending March 21. Market capitalization also increased by 5.3 percent while equity turnover and total shares traded decreased by 33.4 percent and 30.3 percent, respectively **(Table 6).** 

#### **Bond Market**

Bond turnover in the domestic secondary market decreased by 24.4 percent during the week ending March 21 **(Table 6).** In the international market, yields on Kenya's Eurobonds remained stable. The yield on the 10- year Eurobond for Angola increased while that of Zambia decreased **(Chart 2)**.

#### **Global Trends**

Concerns about inflation in advanced economies moderated during the week ending March 21. The UK headline inflation rate declined to 3.4 percent in February from 4.0 percent in January. The US Federal Reserve maintained its policy rate in the range 5.25- 5.50 percent, while Bank of England retained its bank rate at 5.25 percent. The US dollar index strengthened by 0.05 percent against a basket of major currencies during the week ending March 21.

International oil prices increased during the week ending March 21, reflecting increased oil demand amid reduced oil production by OPEC+ exporters. Murban oil price increased to USD 86.30 per barrel on March 21 from USD 84.98 on March 14.




