KEY MONETARY AND FINANCIAL INDICATORS

Exchange Rate

The Kenya Shilling remained relatively stable against major international and regional currencies during the week ending April 4. It exchanged at KSh 100.80 per US Dollar on April 4, compared to KSh 100.88 on March 28 (Table 1).

Foreign Exchange Reserves

The CBK usable foreign exchange reserves remained adequate at USD 8,192.2 million (5.3 months of import cover) as at April 4. This meets the statutory requirement to endeavour to maintain at least 4 months of import cover, and the EAC region's convergence criteria of 4.5 months of import cover (Table 2).

Money Markets

The money market remained liquid during the week ending April 4, largely supported by Government payments. Commercial banks' excess reserves stood at KSh 22.6 billion in relation to the 5.25 percent cash reserves requirement (CRR). The average interbank rate increased to 3.56 percent on April 4 from 3.06 percent on March 28. The average number of interbank deals remained unchanged at 9 while the value traded increased to KSh 2.61 billion from KSh 1.87 billion in the previous week (Table 3).

Government Securities

The Treasury bills auction of April 4, received bids totaling KSh 60.2 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 24.0 billion, representing a performance of 250.8 percent. Interest rates on the three Treasury bills tenures declined (Table 4).

Equity Market

During the week ending April 4, all equity share price indices at the NSE rose, with NASI, NSE 25 and NSE 20 increasing by 2.4 percent, 2.3 percent and 0.4 percent, respectively. Market capitalization rose by 2.4 percent. However, equity turnover and the number of shares traded declined by 1.0 percent and 22.1 percent, respectively (Table 6).

Bonds Market

Trading activity in the secondary bond market declined by 13.7 percent during the week ending April 4. In the international market, yields on Kenya's 5-year, 10-year (2024), 10-year (2028) and 30-year Eurobonds declined by 23.3, 22.8, 17.7 and 7.2 basis points, respectively (Table 6). Similarly, the yields for the 10-year Eurobonds for Ghana and Angola declined during the week (Chart 5).

Global Trends

Uncertainities in the global markets remained during the week. In the UK, Brexit looks increasingly chaotic even as Prime Minister May plans to seek a short extension for Article 50. However, investors were optimistic of a successful conclusion to the US-China talks.

International oil prices increased during the week ending April 4, reflecting an unexpected reduction in crude oil inventories. Murban oil price increased to USD 69.70 per barrel on April 4 compared to USD 67.64 per barrel on March 28.

Chart 1: Inflation Developments

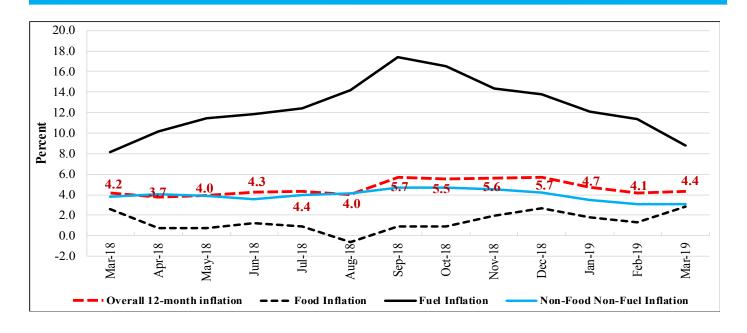

Chart 2: Monthly Remittance Inflows (USD)

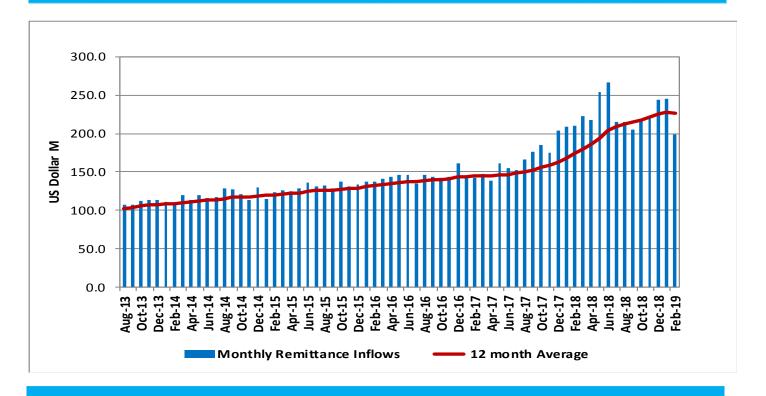


Chart 3: Current Account Balances

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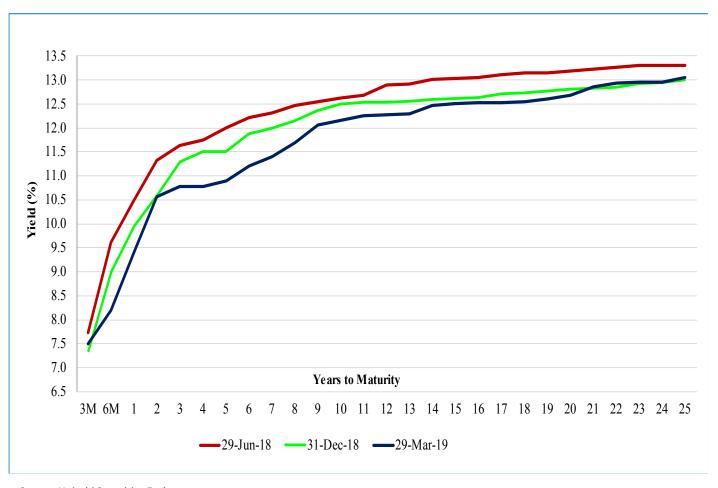

Chart 4: Kenya Government Securities Yield Curve



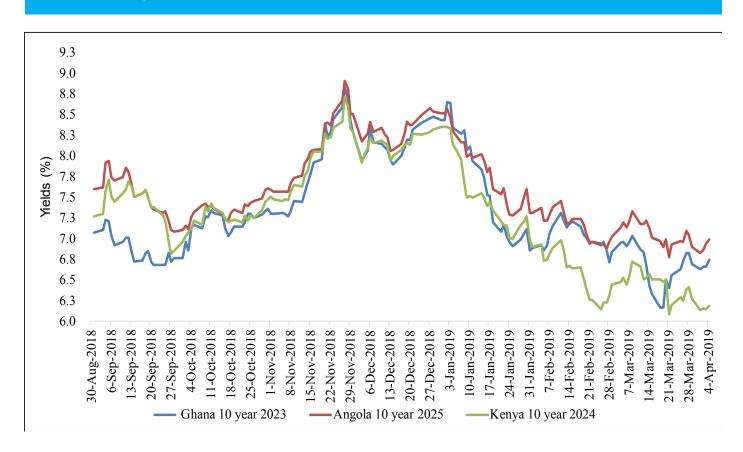
