KEY MONETARY AND FINANCIAL INDICATORS

Exchange Rates

The Kenya Shilling remained relatively stable against major international and regional currencies during the week ending October 22. It exchanged at KSh 108.75 per US dollar on October 22, compared to KSh 108.61 per US dollar on October 15 (Table 1).

Foreign Exchange Reserves

The usable foreign exchange reserves remained adequate at USD 8,223 million (4.99 months of import cover) as at October 22. This meets the CBK's statutory requirement to endeavour to maintain at least 4 months of import cover, and the EAC region's convergence criteria of 4.5 months of import cover (Table 2).

Remittances

Remittance inflows remained strong in September amounting to USD 260.7 million compared to USD 214.7 million in September 2019, an increase of 21.4 percent (Chart 1). The cumulative inflows in the 12 months to September totalled USD 2,967 million compared to USD 2,786 million in the 12 months to September 2019. The US remains the largest source of remittance flows to Kenya recording a growth of 25.2 percent in the year to September.

Money Markets

The money market was relatively liquid during the week ending October 22, supported by government payments, which partly offset tax receipts. Commercial banks' excess reserves stood at KSh 18.5 billion in relation to the 4.2 percent cash reserves requirement (CRR). Open market operations remained active. The average interbank rate was 2.62 percent on October 22 compared to 2.46 percent on October 15. The average number of interbank deals per day increased to 25 from 19 in the previous week, and the value traded increased to KSh 17.4 billion from KSh 8.4 billion in the previous week (Table 3).

Government Securities Market

The Treasury bills auction of October 22 received bids totalling KSh 19.5 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 24.0 billion, representing a performance of 81.34 percent. Interest rates on all the Treasury bills tenors remained relatively stable (Table 4).

Equity Market

The NSE 20 and NSE 25 share price indices declined by 0.5 percent and 0.1 percent, respectively, while the NASI rose by 0.8 percent during the week ending October 22. Similarly, market capitalization increased by 0.8 percent, while equity turnover and total number of shares traded declined by 45.1 percent and 51.5 percent, respectively (Table 6).

Bond Market

Turnover of bonds traded in the domestic secondary market declined by 3.7 percent during the week ending October 22 (Table 6). In the international market, yields on Kenya's Eurobonds declined by an average of 5.9 basis points. The yield on the 10-year Eurobond for Angola increased, while that for Ghana declined marginally (Chart 3).

Global Trends

Global financial markets sentiment was subdued during the week as market optimism of a political compromise on additional US coronavirus fiscal stimulus waned.

International oil prices remained stable during the week. Murban oil price stood at USD 42.09 per barrel on October 22 compared to USD 42.80 per barrel on October 15.






