

## **KEY MONETARY AND FINANCIAL INDICATORS**

# **Exchange Rates**

The Kenya Shilling remained stable against major international and regional currencies during the week ending December 17. It exchanged at KSh 111.59 per US dollar on December 17, compared to KSh 111.44 per US dollar on December 10 (Table 1).

# **Foreign Exchange Reserves**

The usable foreign exchange reserves remained adequate at USD 7,837 million (4.81 months of import cover) as at December 17. This meets the CBK's statutory requirement to endeavor to maintain at least 4 months of import cover, and the EAC region's convergence criteria of 4.5 months of import cover (Table 2).

# **Money Markets**

The money market was relatively liquid during the week ending December 17, supported by government payments, which partly offset tax receipts. Commercial banks' excess reserves stood at KSh 26.2 billion in relation to the 4.25 percent cash reserves requirement (CRR). Open market operations remained active. The average interbank rate was 5.75 percent on December 17 compared to 4.25 percent on December 10. The average number of interbank deals per day increased to 41 from 28 in the previous week, while the average value traded increased to KSh 14.8 billion from KSh 10.6 billion in the previous week (Table 3).

# **Government Securities Market**

The Treasury bills auction of December 17 received bids totalling KSh 21.7 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 24.0 billion, representing a performance of 90.4 percent. Interest rates on all the Treasury bills tenors remained stable, only rising marginally (Table 4).

## **Equity Market**

At the Nairobi Securities Exchange, the NASI, NSE 20 share price index and market capitalisation increased by 0.2 percent, 0.8 percent and 0.3 percent, respectively in the week ending December 17. However, the NSE 25 share price index, total shares traded and total equity turnover declined by 0.3 percent, 16.3 percent and 47.8 percent, respectively in the week under review (Table 6).

### **Bond Market**

Turnover of bonds traded in the domestic secondary market increased by 14.3 percent during the week ending December 17 (Table 6). In the international market, yields on Kenya's Eurobonds increased by an average of 7.0 basis points. The yields on the 10-year Eurobonds for Ghana and Angola also increased (Chart 2).

### **Global Trends**

Global financial markets sentiment improved during the week ending December 17 on account of progress on US fiscal stimulus negotiations, renewed hope of a Brexit trade deal, continued rollout of COVID-19 vaccine, and stronger than expected economic data in Europe. These developments overshadowed negative news of increased virus cases.

International oil prices increased during the week mainly due to strengthening global demand, and decline in crude oil inventory. Murban oil price increased to USD 51.64 per barrel on December 17 from USD 49.32 per barrel on December 10.

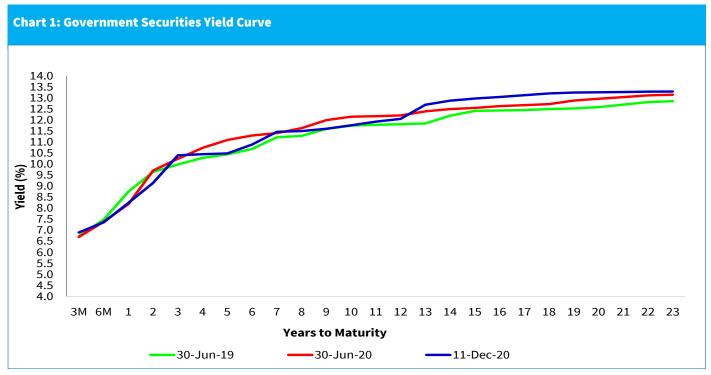

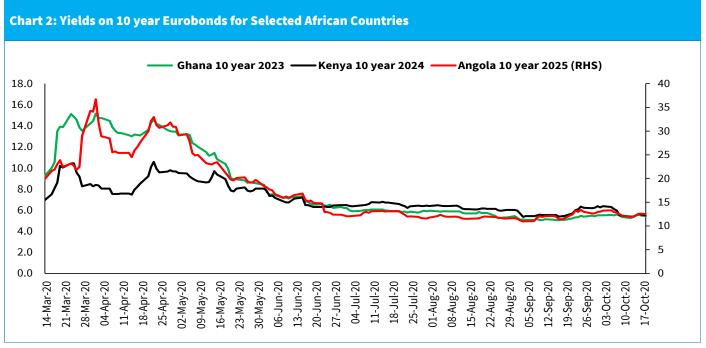
