

### **KEY MONETARY AND FINANCIAL INDICATORS**

# **Exchange Rates**

The Kenya Shilling remained relatively stable against major international and regional currencies during the week ending January 14. It exchanged at KSh 109.97 per US dollar on January 14, compared to KSh 109.47 per US dollar on January 7 (Table 1).

# **Foreign Exchange Reserves**

The usable foreign exchange reserves remained adequate at USD 7,807 million (4.80 months of import cover) as at January 14. This meets the CBK's statutory requirement to endeavour to maintain at least 4 months of import cover, and the EAC region's convergence criteria of 4.5 months of import cover (Table 2).

#### **Remittances**

Remittance inflows remained resilient in December 2020 amounting to USD 299.6 million compared to USD 250.3 in December 2019, an increase of 19.7 percent (Chart 1). Cumulative remittances in 2020 increased to USD 3,094 million from USD 2,796 million in 2019, reflecting a growth of 10.7 percent.

# **Money Market**

The money market was liquid during the week ending January 14, supported by government payments which partly offset tax remittances. Commercial banks' excess reserves stood at KSh 13.0 billion in relation to the 4.25 percent cash reserves requirement (CRR). Open market operations remained active. The average interbank rate was 3.71 percent on January 14 compared to 6.09 percent on January 7. The average number of interbank deals per day increased to 19 from 13 in the previous week, while the average value traded increased to KSh 10.7 billion from KSh 5.2 billion in the previous week (Table 3).

#### **Government Securities Market**

The Treasury bills auction of January 14 received bids totalling KSh 26.4 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 24.0 billion, representing a performance of 110.1 percent. Interest rates remained stable, with the 91-day Treasury bill rate decreasing while the 182-day and 364-day rates increased marginally (Table 4).

### **Equity Market**

At the Nairobi Securities Exchange, the NASI, NSE 25 and NSE 20 share price indices increased by 2.8 percent, 1.8 percent and 2.2 percent respectively, during the week ending January 14. Similarly, market capitalisation, total shares traded and equity turnover rose by 2.8 percent, 10.5 percent and 14.5 percent, respectively (Table 6).

#### **Bonds Market**

Turnover of bonds traded in the domestic secondary market rose by 126.5 percent during the week ending January 14 (Table 6). In the international market, yields on Kenya's Eurobonds remained relatively stable, rising by an average of 15.2 basis points. The yields on the 10-year Eurobonds for Ghana and Angola also remained relatively stable (Chart 3).

#### **Global Trends**

Global financial markets sentiment was lifted during the week ending January 14 by the news of USD 1.9 trillion Covid-19 relief package proposed by US President-elect Joe Biden. Market sentiment was further boosted by widespread rollout of Covid-19 vaccines in many countries.

International oil prices increased during the week ending January 14 after a drawdown in U.S crude stocks and robust data from China showing an increase in imports. Murban oil price increased to USD 55.88 on January 14 from USD 54.53 on January 7.






