



# **RECENT MONETARY AND FINANCIAL DEVELOPMENTS**

### **Exchange Rates**

The Kenya Shilling remained stable against major international and regional currencies during the week ending October 14. It exchanged at KSh 110.81 per US dollar on October 14, compared to KSh 110.69 per US dollar on October 7 (**Table 1**).

## **Foreign Exchange Reserves**

The usable foreign exchange reserves remained adequate at USD 9,261 million (5.66 months of import cover) as at October 14. This meets the CBK's statutory requirement to endeavor to maintain at least 4 months of import cover, and the EAC region's convergence criteria of 4.5 months of import cover (Table 2).

## **Money Market**

The money market was liquid during the week ending October 14, supported by government payments. Commercial banks' excess reserves stood at KSh 10.0 billion in relation to the 4.25 percent cash reserves requirement (CRR). Open market operations remained active. The average interbank rate was 3.64 percent on October 14 compared to 6.11 percent on October 7. During the week, the average number of interbank deals per day remained relatively stable at 27 compared to 29 in the previous week, while the average value traded increased to KSh 13.3 billion from KSh 11.7 billion in the previous week (**Table 3**).

#### **Government Securities Market**

The Treasury bill auction of October 14 received bids totaling KSh 17.8 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 24.0 billion, representing a performance of 74.3 percent. Interest rates on the 91-day and 182-day and 364-day Treasury bills remained stable, with marginal increases (**Table 4**).

### **Equity Market**

At the Nairobi Securities Exchange, the equity turnover and the total shares traded increased by 6.4 percent and 1.4 percent, respectively. However, the NASI, NSE 25, NSE 20 share price indices and market capitalisation, declined by 0.3 percent, 0.7 percent, 1.5 percent and 0.4 percent, respectively during the week ending October 14 (**Table 6**).

### **Bonds Market**

Bonds turnover in the domestic secondary market declined by 26.4 percent during the week ending October 14 (**Table 6**). In the international market, yields on Kenya's Eurobonds marginally increased by an average of 7.0 basis points. The yield on the 10-year Eurobond for Ghana increased, while that of Angola declined (**Chart 2**).

#### **Global Trends**

Global financial markets sentiment improved during the week ending October 14, due to better than expected economic data that offset worries about inflationary pressures. Sentiment was also driven by the latest release of the World Economic Outlook (WEO) that projected the global growth at 5.9 percent in 2021.

International oil price increased during the week ending October 14 as leading oil producer Saudi Arabia opposed calls for additional OPEC+ production amid surging oil demand. Murban oil price rose to USD 83.39 per barrel on October 14 from USD 78.30 per barrel on October 7.

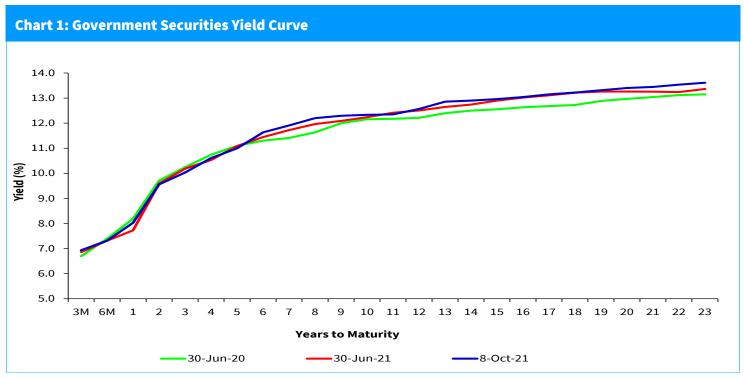

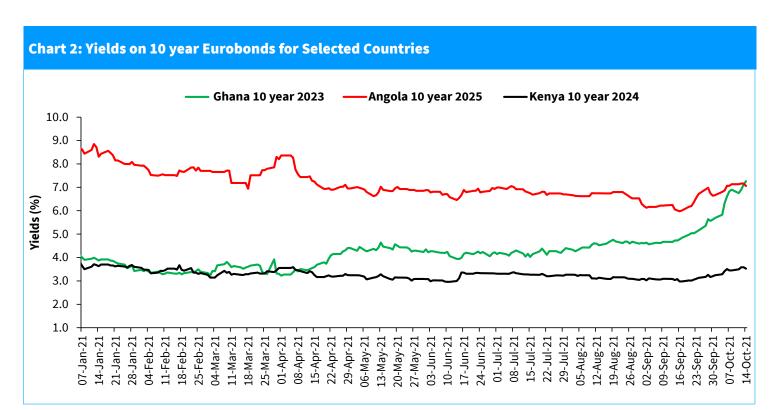
