# **KEY MONETARY AND FINANCIAL INDICATORS**

### **Monetary Policy Committee Meeting**

The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) met on May 26 and noted that inflation expectations remained well anchored within the target range, and the economy continued to operate below its potential level following the impact of COVID-19 pandemic. The MPC concluded that the current accommodative monetary policy stance remains appropriate, and therefore decided to retain the Central Bank Rate (CBR) at 7.00 percent.

# **Exchange Rates**

The Kenya Shilling remained stable against major international and regional currencies during the week ending May 27. It exchanged at KSh 107.57 per US dollar on May 27, compared to KSh 107.92 per US dollar on May 20 (Table 1).

### **Foreign Exchange Reserves**

The usable foreign exchange reserves remained adequate at USD 7,480 million (4.57 months of import cover) as at May 27. This meets the CBK's statutory requirement to endeavour to maintain at least 4 months of import cover, and the EAC region's convergence criteria of 4.5 months of import cover (Table 2).

### **Money Markets**

The money market was liquid during the week ending May 27, supported by government payments, which partly offset tax remittances. Commercial banks' excess reserves stood at KSh 15.5 billion in relation to the 4.25 percent cash reserves requirement (CRR). Open market operations remained active. The average interbank rate was 5.01 percent on May 27 compared to 4.92 percent on May 20. During the week, the average number of interbank deals per day increased to 24 from 17 in the previous week, while the average value traded increased to KSh 8.5 billion compared with KSh 7.6 billion in the previous week (Table 3).

# **Government Securities Market**

The Treasury bills auction of May 27 received bids totalling KSh 36.6 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 24.0 billion, representing a performance of 152.4

percent. Interest rates on the Treasury bills remained stable, only declining marginally (Table 4).

# **Equity Market**

At the Nairobi Securities Exchange, the NASI, NSE 25 and NSE 20 share price indices increased by 3.1 percent, 3.2 percent and 0.6 percent, respectively, during the week ending May 27. Similarly, market capitalization, equity turnover and total shares traded increased by 3.1 percent, 71.8 percent and 31.2 percent, respectively (Table 6).

### **Bonds Market**

Turnover of bonds in the domestic secondary market increased by 90.3 percent during the week ending May 27 (Table 6). In the international market, yields on Kenya's Eurobonds declined by an average of 14.5 basis points. The yields on the 10-year Eurobonds for Ghana and Angola also declined (Chart 2).

#### **Global Trends**

Global financial markets sentiment improved during the week following assurance to the investors by central banks in major economies that the recent rise in inflation was transitory and that inflation expectations were well anchored. However, most investors continue to wait for decisions of the Fed and the ECB during their June meetings.

International oil prices increased during the week, due to increase in demand. Murban oil price increased to USD 67.33 per barrel on May 27 from USD 65.68 per barrel on May 20.

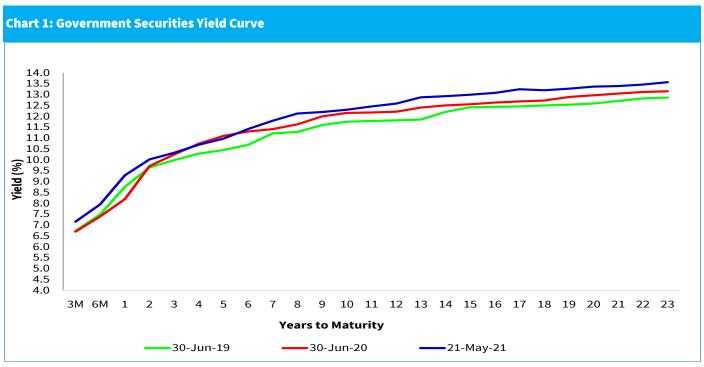

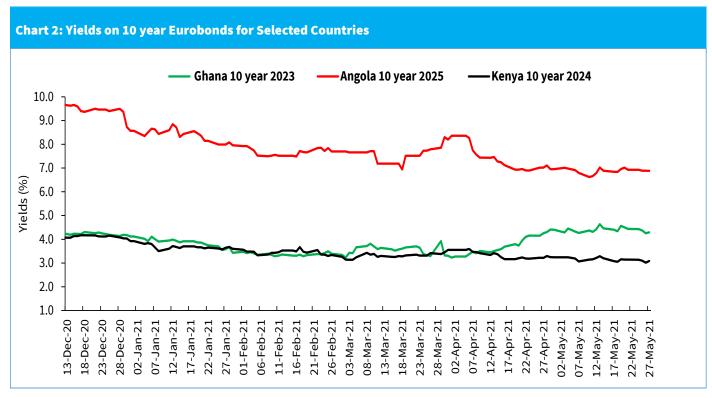
