



RECENT MONETARY AND FINANCIAL DEVELOPMENTS

Exchange Rates

The Kenya Shilling remained stable against major international and regional currencies during the week ending August 5. It exchanged at KSh 108.67 per US dollar on August 5, compared to KSh 108.59 per US dollar on July 29 **(Table 1)**.

Foreign Exchange Reserves

The usable foreign exchange reserves remained adequate at USD 9,352 million (5.72 months of import cover) as at August 5. This meets the CBK's statutory requirement to endeavour to maintain at least 4 months of import cover, and the EAC region's convergence criteria of 4.5 months of import cover **(Table 2)**.

Money Market

The money market was liquid during the week ending August 5, supported by government payments, which offset tax remittances. Commercial banks' excess reserves stood at KSh 10.6 billion in relation to the 4.25 percent cash reserves requirement (CRR). Open market operations remained active. The average interbank rate was 3.29 percent on August 5 compared to 3.32 percent on July 29. During the week, the average number of interbank deals per day increased to 23 from 12 in the previous week, while the average value traded increased to KSh 9.9 billion from KSh 4.1 billion **(Table 3)**.

Government Securities Market

The Treasury bills auctions of August 5, received bids totalling KSh 23.9 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 24.0 billion, representing a performance of 99.8 percent.

Interest rates on the Treasury bills remained stable, with the 91-day and 182-day rates increasing marginally while the 364-day declined **(Table 4)**.

Equity Market

At the Nairobi Securities Exchange, total shares traded and equity turnover rose by 5.0 percent and 18.3 percent, respectively, during the week ending August 5. However, the NASI, NSE 25, and NSE 20 share price indices declined marginally. Similarly, market capitalization declined marginally (**Table 6**).

Bonds Market

Turnover of bonds in the domestic secondary market rose by 4.6 percent during the week ending August 5 (Table 6). In the international market, yields on Kenya's Eurobonds remained stable, declining by an average of 1.6 basis points. The yields on the 10-year Eurobonds for Ghana and Angola also remained stable **(Chart 2)**.

Global Trends

Global financial markets sentiment was subdued during the week ending August 5, on concerns over the impact of rising COVID-19 Delta variant infections on global economic activity. A smaller decline in US Jobless claims further weighed on market sentiment.

International oil prices declined during the week, reflecting a larger than expected build up in oil stocks in the US and concerns regarding the spread of the COVID-19 Delta variant. Murban oil price declined to USD 69.51 per barrel on August 5, from USD 74.65 per barrel on July 29.

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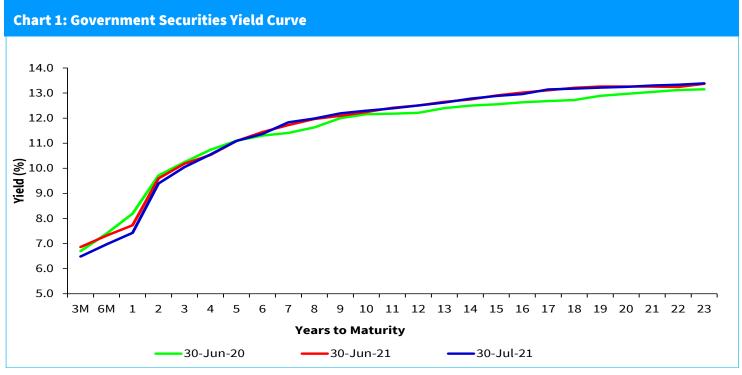

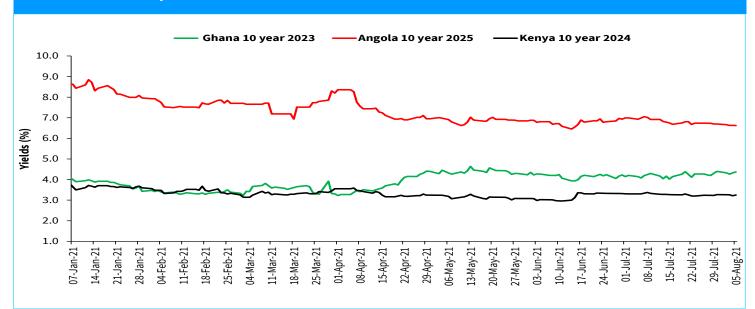
