



KEY MONETARY AND FINANCIAL INDICATORS

Exchange Rate

The Kenya Shilling remained relatively stable against major international and regional currencies during the week ending May 14. It exchanged at KSh 106.59 per US dollar on May 14 compared to KSh 106.08 on May 7 (Table 1).

Foreign Exchange Reserves

The CBK usable foreign exchange reserves remained adequate at USD 8,532 million (5.14 months of import cover) as at May 14. This meets the CBK's statutory requirement to endeavour to maintain at least 4 months of import cover, and the EAC region's convergence criteria of 4.5 months of import cover (Table 2).

Current Account

Preliminary data on balance of payments shows that the current account deficit was estimated at 6.2 percent of GDP in the 12 months to March 2020 compared to 5.8 percent in the 12 months to December 2019. This reflects lower receipts from horticulture and service exports (Chart 1).

Money Market

The money market was relatively liquid during the week ending May 14, supported by government payments which more than offset tax remittances. Commercial banks' excess reserves stood at KSh 36.5 billion in relation to the 4.25 percent cash reserves requirement (CRR). Open market operations remained active. The average interbank rate was 4.22 percent on May 14 compared to 4.05 percent on May 7. The average number of interbank deals per day increased to 24 from 20 in the previous week, while the value traded increased to KSh 11.8 billion from KSh 7.9 billion in the previous week (Table 3).

Government Securities Market

The Treasury bills auction of May 14 received bids totaling KSh 24.1 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 24.0 billion, representing a performance of 100.4 percent. Interest rates on all the three Treasury bill tenors increased marginally (Table 4).

Equity Market

At the Nairobi Securities Exchange, the number of shares traded rose by 20.4 percent during the week ending May 14. However, the NASI, NSE 25 and NSE 20 share price indices declined by 6.0 percent, 6.8 percent and 3.5 percent, respectively. Similarly, market capitalization and

equity turnover declined by 6.0 percent and 7.5 percent, respectively (Table 6).

Bond Market

Turnover of bonds traded in the domestic secondary market increased by 15.6 percent during the week (Table 6). In the international market, yields on Kenya's Eurobonds increased by an average of 82.5 basis points. The yields on the 10-year Eurobonds for Angola and Ghana also increased towards the end of the week (Chart 3).

Global Trends

Global financial markets sentiment remained edgy as the negative impact of covid-19 continues to be felt. Despite the optimism arising from the gradual easing of lockdown in some countries, signs of weak economic performance in the Eurozone were shown in the contraction of the German economy by 2.2 percent in the first quarter of 2020, the sharpest contraction since the financial crisis.

International oil prices increased during the week following optimism arising from the gradual easing of the lockdowns in some countries. Murban oil price increased to USD 30.34 per barrel on May 14 from USD 27.67 per barrel on May 6.

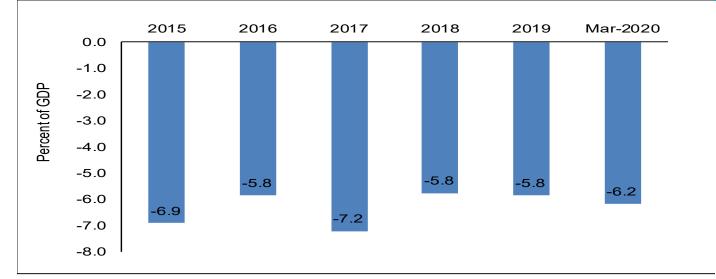

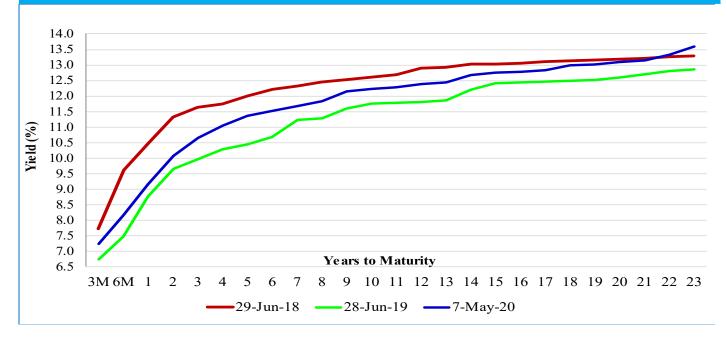
Chart 1: Current Account

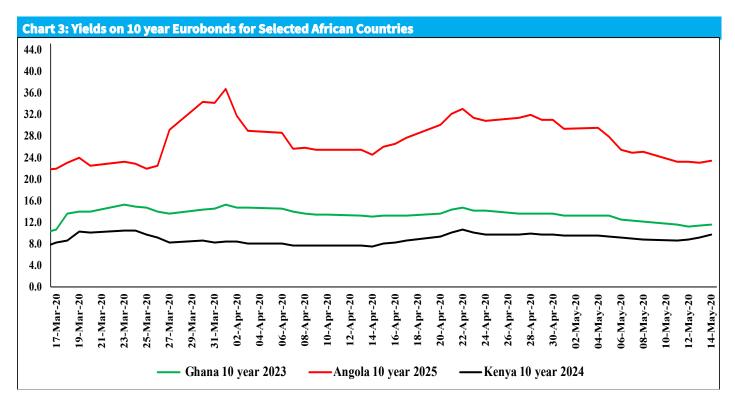
