KEY MONETARY AND FINANCIAL INDICATORS

Exchange Rates

The Kenya Shilling remained relatively stable against major international and regional currencies during the week ending October 8. It exchanged at KSh 108.53 per US dollar on October 8, compared to KSh 108.45 per US dollar on October 1 (Table 1).

Foreign Exchange Reserves

The usable foreign exchange reserves remained adequate at USD 8,457 million (5.13 months of import cover) as at October 8. This meets the CBK's statutory requirement to endeavour to maintain at least 4 months of import cover, and the EAC region's convergence criteria of 4.5 months of import cover (Table 2).

Money Markets

The money market was liquid during the week ending October 8, mainly reflecting government payments. Commercial banks' excess reserves stood at KSh 14.8 billion in relation to the 4.25 percent cash reserves requirement (CRR). Open market operations remained active. The average interbank rate was 2.08 percent on October 8 compared to 3.58 percent on October 1. The average number of interbank deals per day declined to 19 from 21 in the previous week while the value traded declined to KSh 8.4 billion from KSh 8.7 billion in the previous week (Table 3).

Government Securities Market

The Treasury bills auction of October 8 received bids totalling KSh 26.4 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 24.0 billion, representing a performance of 110.0 percent. Interest rates on the Treasury bills remained relatively stable (Table 4).

Equity Market

At the Nairobi Securities Exchange (NSE), all the share price indices declined during the week ending October 8. The NSE 20 and NSE 25 share price indices declined by 1.3 percent while the NASI decreased by 0.2 percent. Similarly, market capitalization, equity turnover and total number of shares traded declined by 0.2 percent, 39.0 percent and 45.0 percent, respectively (Table 6).

Bond Market

Turnover of bonds traded in the domestic secondary market declined by 0.6 percent during the week ending October 8 (Table 6). In the international market, yields on Kenya's Eurobonds decreased by an average of 42.6 basis points. The yield on the 10-year Eurobond for Angola also declined but that of Ghana rose marginally (Chart 2).

Global Trends

Global financial markets were relatively calm during the week ending October 8, supported by rising expectations of further fiscal stimulus in the U.S., and increased optimism about the potential outcome of Brexit negotiations. However, concerns remained on the spike in COVID-19 infections in Europe, with additional restrictions expected to be unveiled in France and UK.

International oil prices increased during the week reflecting recovery in global demand. Murban oil price increased to USD 42.28 per barrel on October 8 from USD 41.39 per barrel on October 1.




