



# RECENT MONETARY AND FINANCIAL DEVELOPMENTS

## **Exchange Rates**

The Kenya Shilling remained stable against major international and regional currencies during the week ending June 9. It exchanged at KSh 117.29 per US dollar on June 16, compared to KSh 117.01 per US dollar on June 9 (Table 1).

## **Foreign Exchange Reserves**

The usable foreign exchange reserves remained adequate at USD 8,114 million (4.82 months of import cover) as of June 16. This meets the CBK's statutory requirement to endeavor to maintain at least 4 months of import cover, and the EAC region's convergence criteria of 4.5 months of import cover (Table 2).

#### Remittances

Remittance inflows in May 2022 totalled USD 339.7 million compared to USD 315.8 million in May 2021, a 7.6 percent increase (**Chart 1**). The cumulative inflows for the 12 months to May 2022 totalled USD 3,992 million compared to USD 3,365 million in the same period in 2021, an increase of 18.6 percent. The strong remittances inflows continue to support the current account and the stability of the exchange rate. The US remains the largest source of remittances into Kenya, accounting for 57 percent in May 2022.

#### **Money Market**

The money market was relatively liquid during the week ending June 16, partly reflecting government payments which offset tax remittances. Commercial banks' excess reserves stood at KSh 45.2 billion in relation to the 4.25 percent cash reserves requirement (CRR). Open market operations remained active. The average interbank rate was 5.30 percent on June 16 compared to 4.94 percent on June 9. During the week, the average number of interbank deals decreased to 21 from 38 in the previous week, while the average value traded decreased to KSh 12.8 billion from KSh 28.3 billion in the previous week (**Table 3**).

## **Government Securities Market**

The Treasury bill auction of June 16, received bids totalling KSh 19.4 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 24.0 billion, representing a performance of 80.8 percent. Interest rates remained stable, with all the Treasury bills rates increasing marginally **(Table 4).** 

## **Equity Market**

At the Nairobi Securities Exchange, NASI, NSE 25 and NSE 20 share price indices declined by 4.5 percent, 4.7 percent and 3.2 percent, respectively. Market capitalization declined by 4.6 percent, while total shares traded and equity turnover increased by 0.3 percent and 1.1 percent, respectively, during the week ending June 16 (**Table 6**).

## **Bonds Market**

Bond turnover in the domestic secondary market increased by 44.1 percent during the week ending June 16 (**Table 6**). In the international market, the yields on Kenya's Eurobonds increased by an average of 114.2 basis points. Similarly, the yield on the 10-Year Eurobonds for Angola and Ghana also increased (**Chart 3**).

## **Global Trends**


Inflationary pressure persisted in the week ending June 16. The US Federal reserve and the Bank of England raised their benchmark interest rates by 75 basis points and 25 basis points, respectively during the week. Major financial markets remained volatile.

International oil prices declined during the week ending June 16. Murban oil prices fell to USD 118.24 per barrel, compared to USD 122.39 per barrel on June 9.




