

## KEY MONETARY AND FINANCIAL INDICATORS

## **Exchange Rate**

The Kenya Shilling remained stable against major international and regional currencies during the week ending October 24. It exchanged at KSh 103.51 per US Dollar on October 24, compared to KSh 103.71 on October 17 (Table 1).

## **Foreign Exchange Reserves**

The CBK usable foreign exchange reserves remained adequate at USD 8,944 million (5.59 months of import cover) as at October 24. This meets the CBK's statutory requirement to endeavour to maintain at least 4 months of import cover, and the EAC region's convergence criteria of 4.5 months of import cover (Table 2).

#### Remittances

Remittance inflows amounted to USD 214.7 million in September 2019 compared to USD 214.3 million recorded in August. The cumulative inflows in the 12-months to September 2019 increased to USD 2,786 million compared to USD 2,579 million in September 2018, reflecting a growth of 8.0 percent (Chart 1). North America, Europe and the Rest of the World accounted for 51 percent, 19 percent and 30 percent, respectively, of the total remittances in September.

#### **Money Market**

The money market was liquid during the week ending October 24, mainly due to Government payments and net redemptions of government securities, which partly offset tax remittances. Commercial banks' excess reserves stood at KSh 17.8 billion in relation to the 5.25 percent cash reserves requirement (CRR). The open market operations remained active. The average interbank rate decreased to 6.76 percent on October 24 from 7.59 percent on October 17. The average number of interbank deals per day increased to 19 from 13 the previous week, while the value traded also increased to KSh 12.4 billion from KSh 5.5 billion in the previous week (Table 3).

#### **Government Securities Market**

The Treasury bills auctions of October 24 received

bids totaling KSh 17.5 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 24.0 billion, representing a performance of 72.8 percent. Interest rates on the 91-day Treasury bills increased slightly, while those of 182 and 364-day Treasury bills declined marginally (Table 4).

The Treasury bonds auction of October 23, for the 16year infrastructure bond, received bids totaling KSh 86.9 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 60.0 billion, representing a performance of 144.9 percent. Interest rates on the bond declined compared to the previous issue of similar securities (Table 5).

# **Equity Market**

The NASI, NSE 20 and NSE 25 share price indices increased by 1.2 percent, 1.1 percent, and 2.0 percent, respectively, during the week ending October 24 (Table 6). Market capitalization increased by 2.4 percent following the listing of 793.8 million NCBA shares on October 22.

## **Bond Market**

Trading activity in the domestic secondary bond market decreased by 55.4 percent during the week ending October 24 (Table 6). In the international market, yields on Kenya's 7-year, 10-year (2024), 12-year and 30-year Eurobonds declined by 2.4, 3.5, 15.7 and 0.4 basis points, respectively (Table 6). Yields on 10-year Eurobonds for Angola and Ghana also declined during the week (Chart 3).

#### **Global Trends**

Uncertainties remained in the global financial markets during the week ending October 25. Particularly, the EU member states were expected to discuss, on October 25, the possible length of Brexit extension to offer the UK, after its Parliament rejected the deal negotiated by the Prime Minister.

International oil prices increased during the week following news of a drop in U.S. crude oil supplies. The Murban oil price increased to USD 63.30 per barrel on October 24, from USD 61.22 per barrel on October 17.

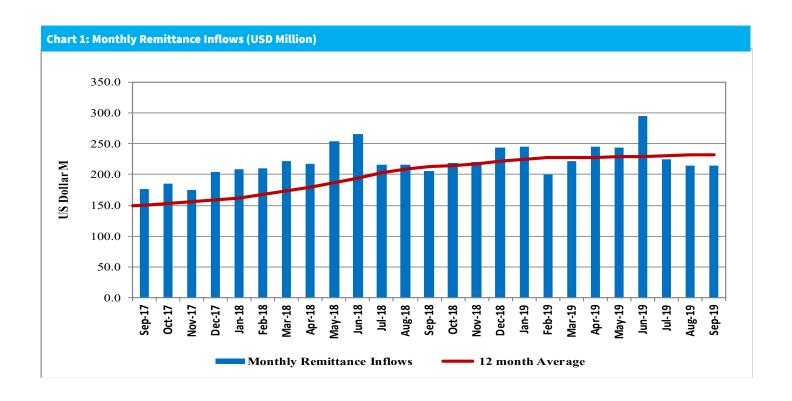


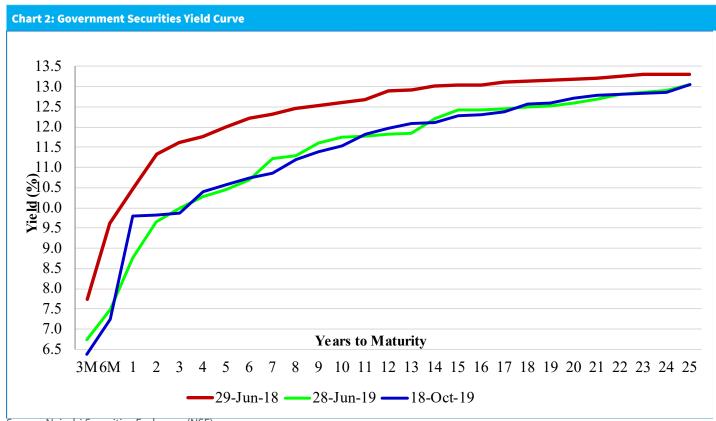

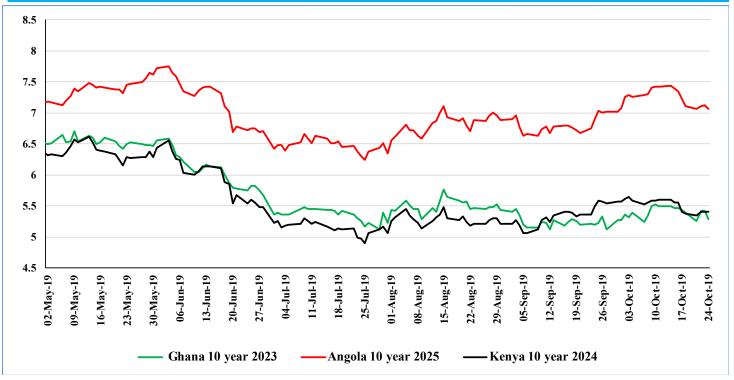
