RECENT MONETARY AND FINANCIAL DEVELOPMENTS

Exchange Rates

The Kenya Shilling remained stable against major international and regional currencies during the week ending July 22. It exchanged at KSh 108.20 per US dollar on July 22, compared to KSh 108.03 per US dollar on July 15 **(Table 1)**.

Foreign Exchange Reserves

The usable foreign exchange reserves remained adequate at USD 9,371 million (5.73 months of import cover) as at July 22 **(Table 2)**. This meets the CBK's statutory requirement to endeavour to maintain at least 4 months of import cover, and the EAC region's convergence criteria of 4.5 months of import cover.

Money Market

The money market was liquid during the week ending July 22, supported by government payments, which offset tax remittances. Commercial banks' excess reserves stood at KSh 22.4 billion in relation to the 4.25 percent cash reserves requirement (CRR). Open market operations remained active. The average interbank rate was 3.05 percent on July 22, compared to 3.83 percent on July 15. During the week, the average number of interbank deals per day decreased to 11 from 14 in the previous week, while the average value traded remained stable at KSh 4.6 billion (**Table 3**).

Government Securities Market

The Treasury bill auction of July 22, received bids totaling KSh 16.7 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 24.0 billion, representing a performance of 69.6 percent. Interest rates on the Treasury bills declined **(Table 4)**.

Equity Market

At the Nairobi Securities Exchange, the NASI and NSE 20 share price index rose by 0.1 percent and 0.5 percent, respectively. Similarly, market capitalization rose by 0.1 percent. However, NSE 25 share price index, total shares traded and equity turnover declined by 0.2 percent, 17.2 percent and 17.4 percent, respectively, during the week ending July 22 **(Table 6)**.

Bonds Market

Turnover of bonds in the domestic secondary market declined by 36.2 percent during the week ending July 22 **(Table 6)**. In the primary market, Acorn issued a final tranche of the green bond, which raised KSh 2.1 billion against the target of KSh 1.4 billion, representing a performance of 146 percent. In the international market, yields on Kenya's Eurobonds rose by an average of 1.4 basis points. The yields on the 10-year Eurobonds for Ghana and Angola also rose **(Chart 2)**.

Global Trends

Global financial markets warmed up to reports of strong growth indicators and strong corporate earnings during the week ending July 22. However, concerns about the spread of the COVID delta variant lingered in the market.

International oil prices fell during the week due to inventory build-up. Murban oil price declined to USD 70.78 per barrel on July 22, from USD 71.75 per barrel on July 15.

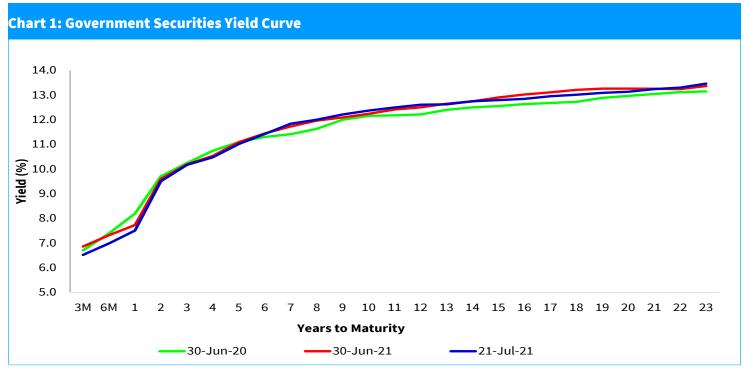

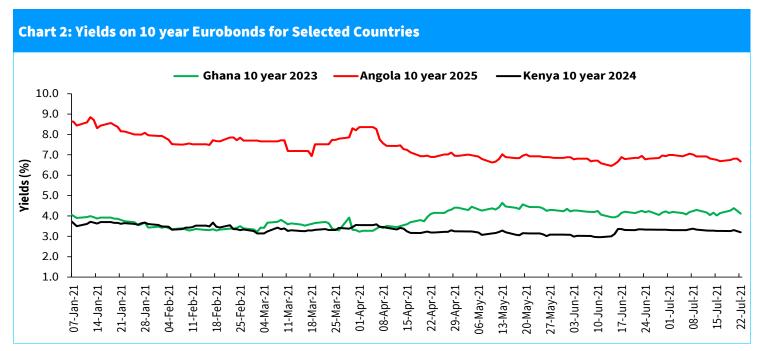
