

KEY MONETARY AND FINANCIAL INDICATORS

Exchange Rates

The Kenya Shilling remained stable against major international and regional currencies during the week ending June 10. It exchanged at KSh 107.90 per US dollar on June 10, compared to KSh 107.73 per US dollar on June 3 (Table 1).

Foreign Exchange Reserves

The usable foreign exchange reserves remained adequate at USD 7,506 million (4.59 months of import cover) as at June 10. This meets the CBK's statutory requirement to endeavour to maintain at least 4 months of import cover, and the EAC region's convergence criteria of 4.5 months of import cover (Table 2).

Money Markets

The money market was liquid during the week ending June 10, supported by government payments, which offset tax remittances. Commercial banks' excess reserves stood at KSh 14.1 billion in relation to the 4.25 percent cash reserves requirement (CRR). Open market operations remained active. The average interbank rate was 4.04 percent on June 10 compared to 4.77 percent on June 3. During the week, the average number of interbank deals per day decreased to 18 from 28 in the previous week, while the average value traded decreased to KSh 10.2 billion compared to KSh 13.6 billion in the previous week (Table 3).

Government Securities Market

The Treasury bills auction of June 10 received bids totalling KSh 43.6 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 24.0 billion, representing a performance of 181.8 percent. Interest rates on the Treasury bills declined (Table 4).

Equity Market

At the Nairobi Securities Exchange, the NASI, NSE 25 and NSE 20 share price indices increased by 0.9 percent, 1.5 percent and 0.2 percent, respectively, during the week ending June 10. Similarly, market capitalization, total shares traded and equity turnover increased by 0.9 percent, 28.4 percent and 41.1 percent, respectively (Table 6).

Bonds Market

Turnover of bonds in the domestic secondary market declined by 13.3 percent during the week ending June 10 (Table 6). In the international market, yields on Kenya's Eurobonds declined by an average of 9.1 basis points. The yields on the 10-year Eurobonds for Ghana and Angola also declined (Chart 2).

Global Trends

Global financial markets remained calm during the week ending June 10, as investors balanced the higher than expected US May inflation and ECB's confirmation of an accommodative monetary policy.

International oil prices increased during the week, supported by increase in demand amid concerns on possible return of Iranian supply. Murban oil price increased to USD 71.49 per barrel on June 10 from USD 70.71 per barrel on June 3.

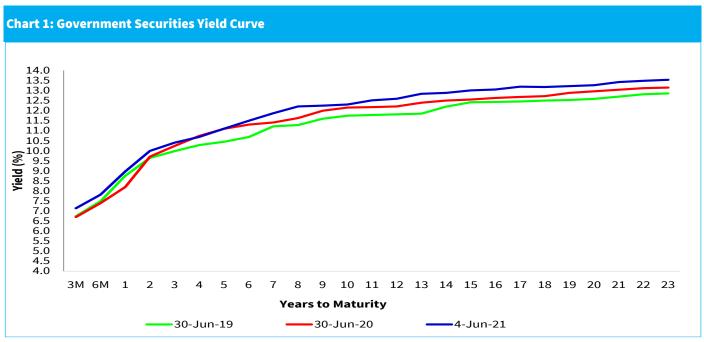

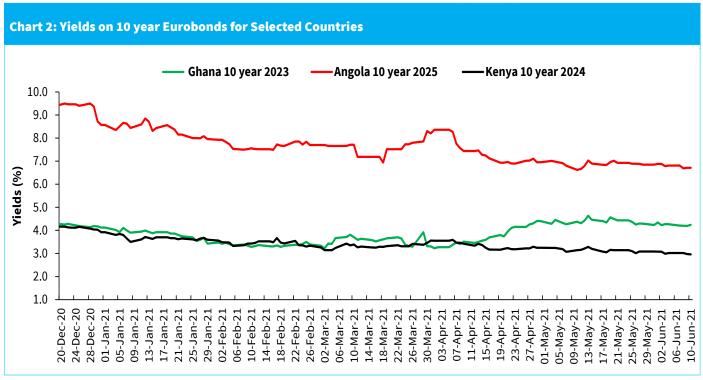
