### KEY MONETARY AND FINANCIAL INDICATORS

# Monetary Policy Committee Meeting

The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) retained the Central Bank Rate (CBR) at 9.00 percent during its Meeting on July 24. The Committee noted that inflation expectations remained well anchored within the target range, and that the economy was operating close to its potential. However, there was need to be vigilant on the possible effects of the recent increases in fuel prices, the ongoing demonetisation, and the increased uncertainties in the external environment.

# **Exchange Rate**

The Kenya Shilling remained stable against major international and regional currencies during the week ending July 25. It exchanged at KSh 104.03 per US Dollar on July 25, compared to KSh 103.06 on July 18 (Table 1).

# Foreign Exchange Reserves

The CBK usable foreign exchange reserves remained strong at USD 9,568 million (6.0 months of import cover) as at July 25. This meets the CBK's statutory requirement of maintaining at least 4 months of import cover and the EAC region's convergence criteria of 4.5 months of import cover (Table 2).

#### **Current Account**

The current account deficit narrowed to 4.2 percent of GDP in the 12 months to June 2019 from 5.4 percent in June 2018. This reflects resilient performance of exports of horticulture, strong growth in diaspora remittances, higher receipts from tourism and transport services and slower growth of imports of food and SGR-related equipment (Chart 1).

### Money Market

The money market remained liquid during the week ending July 25. Commercial banks' excess reserves stood at KSh 5.60 billion in relation to the 5.25 percent cash reserves requirement (CRR). The average interbank rate stood at 2.61 percent on July 25 compared to 2.00 percent on July 18. The average number of interbank deals increased to 16 from 13, while the value traded increased to KSh 10.04 billion from KSh 9.80 billion in the previous week (Table 3).

## **Government Securities Market**

The Treasury bills auctions of July 25 received bids totaling KSh 27.2 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 24.0 billion, representing a performance of 113.5 percent. Interest rates on Treasury bills tenures increased (Table 4).

The 15-year Treasury bond floated during the July 24 auction received bids totalling KSh 86.7 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 40.0 bn, representing a performance of 216.7 percent (Table 5).

## **Equity Market**

The NSE 25 share index, equity turnover and the total shares traded increased by 0.09 percent, 4.33 percent and 6.98 percent, respectively. However, Market Capitalization, NASI and NSE 20 share index declined by 0.30 percent, 0.29 percent and 0.47 percent, respectively (Table 6).

#### **Derivatives Market**

The total volume of futures contracts settled on the NSE Derivatives Market (NEXT) during the week ending July 25, was 38 valued at KSh 1,176,780 compared to 7 valued at KSh 416,580 in the previous week.

#### **Bonds Market**

Trading activity in the domestic bond secondary market decreased by 31.11 percent during the week ending July 25. In the international market, yields on Kenya's 7-year, 10-year (2024), 10-year (2028), 12-year and 30-year Eurobonds declined by 18.3, 18.7, 20.1, 16.6 and 11.9 basis points, respectively (Table 6). The yields on 10-year Eurobonds for Ghana and Angola also decreased (Chart 3).

#### **Global Trends**

Boris Johnson was elected new UK Prime Minister with a promise to deliver Brexit by October 31. In its July 2019 WEO update, the IMF revised global growth for 2019 and 2020 downwards by 0.1 percentage points to 3.2 percent and 3.5 percent, respectively, reflecting the negative effect of trade tensions, Brexit uncertainties and geopolitical tensions.

International oil prices increased during the week reflecting the heightened tension in the Gulf. The Murban oil price stood at USD 64.95 per barrel on July 25 from USD 63.90 per barrel on July 18.

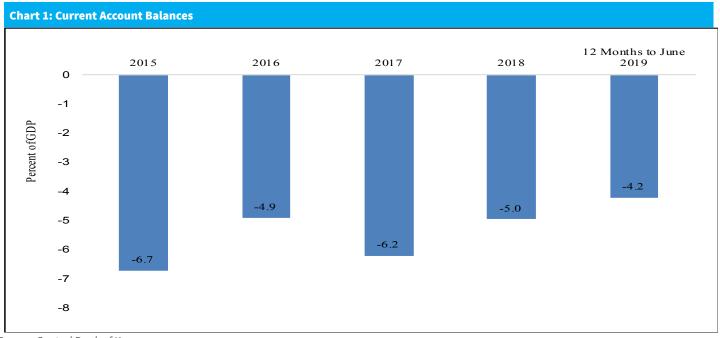

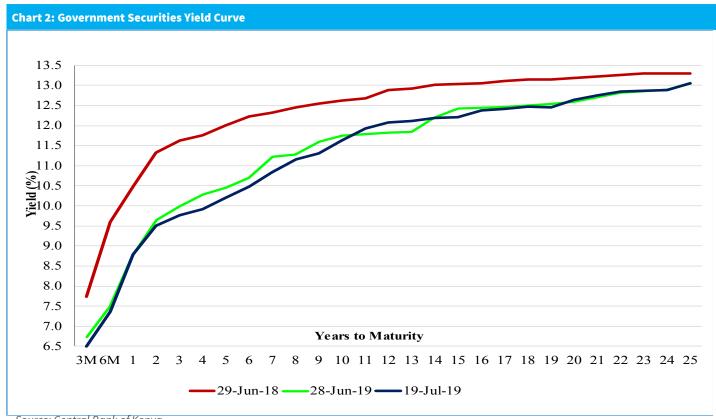

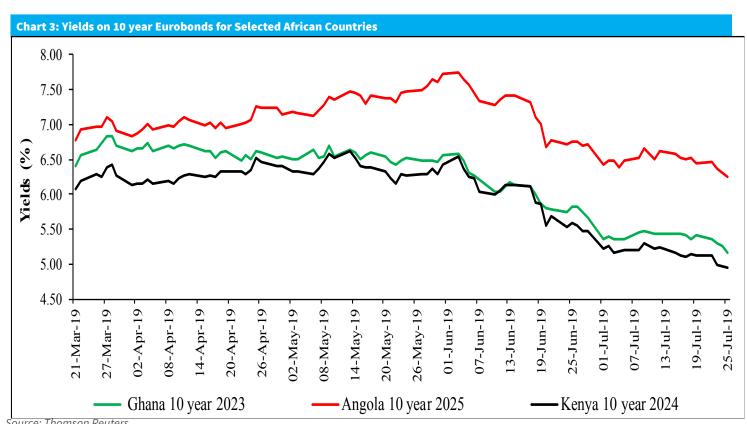
