KEY MONETARY AND FINANCIAL INDICATORS

Exchange Rate

The Kenya Shilling remained stable against major international and regional currencies during the week ending July 18. It exchanged at KSh 103.06 per US Dollar on July 18, compared to KSh 102.92 on July 11 (Table 1).

Foreign Exchange Reserves

The CBK usable foreign exchange reserves remained adequate at USD 9,747 million (6.2 months of import cover) as at July 18. This meets the CBK's statutory requirement to endeavor to maintain at least 4 months of import cover, and the EAC region's convergence criteria of 4.5 months of import cover (Table 2).

Remittance

The remittance inflows rose to an all-time high in June 2019 amounting to USD 295 million compared to USD 243 million in May. The 12-month cumulative inflows to June 2019 increased to USD 2,768 million from USD 2,438 million in the 12 months to June 2018, reflecting a 13.6 percent growth (Chart 1). North America, Europe and the Rest of the World accounted for 38 percent, 32 percent and 30 percent, respectively, of the remittances in June 2019 (Chart 1).

Money Market

The money market was relatively liquid during the week ending July 18, largely supported by Government payments, which more than offset tax remittances. Commercial banks' excess reserves stood at KSh 8.96 billion in relation to the 5.25 percent cash reserves requirement (CRR). The average interbank rate decreased to 2.00 percent on July 18 from 2.38 percent on July 11. The average number of interbank deals remained the same during the two weeks while the value traded increased to KSh 9.8 billion from KSh 6.85 billion in the previous week (Table 3).

Government Securities Market

The Treasury bills auctions of July 18 received bids totaling KSh 26.0 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 24.0

billion, representing a performance of 108.4 percent. Interest rates on the 91-day and 182-day Treasury bill tenures declined while that on the 364-day Treasury bill increased marginally (Table 4).

Equity Market

At the Nairobi Securities Exchange (NSE), total shares, total deals, NASI and market capitalization increased by 10.62 percent, 2.90 percent, and 0.13 percent, respectively. However, the equity turnover, NSE 25 Share Index and NSE 20 share index declined by 7.12 percent, 0.66 percent and 0.38 percent, respectively (Table 6).

Derivatives Market

The total volume of futures contracts settled at the NSE Derivatives Market (NEXT) during the week ending July 18 declined to 7 that were valued at KSh 416,580 compared to 47 futures contracts valued at KSh 2,401,440 in the previous week.

Bonds Market

The trading activity in the secondary domestic bond market increased by 25.20 percent during the week ending July 18. In the international market, yields on Kenya's 7-year, 10-year (2024), 10-year (2028), 12-year and 30-year Eurobonds decreased by 4.3, 7.8, 5.5, 13.9 and 4.7 basis points, respectively (Table 6). The yields on 10-year Eurobonds for Ghana and Angola also decreased during the week (Chart 3).

Global Trends

Global markets reacted positively to the passing of a legislation by UK Parliament preventing the next Prime Minister from pursuing a no-deal Brexit. However, there are still concerns in the global markets about the outlook for corporate earnings and global trade.

International oil prices declined during the week following an increase in U.S gasoline stocks and lower than expected US oil demand. Murban oil price decreased to US\$ 64.00 per barrel on July 18 from US\$ 67.33 per barrel on July 11.




Chart 1: Remittances


