



RECENT MONETARY AND FINANCIAL DEVELOPMENTS

GDP Output for 2020

Economic Survey 2021, which is based on revised and rebased national accounts shows that the economy was larger by 5.3 percent in 2019 in nominal terms compared to the previous estimate (**Table 1**). In 2020, the size of the economy is estimated at Ksh 10.8 trillion.

The economy contracted for the first time in recent history, due to the devastating impact of the COVID-19 shock. Real GDP growth contracted by 0.3 percent in 2020 compared to growth of 5.0 percent in 2019, following the impact of COVID-19 pandemic which mainly affected the services sector (Table 2).

Exchange Rates

The Kenya Shilling remained stable against major international and regional currencies during the week ending September 9. It exchanged at KSh 110.10 per US dollar on September 9, compared to KSh 109.93 per US dollar on September 2 (**Table 3**).

Foreign Exchange Reserves

The usable foreign exchange reserves remained adequate at USD 9,629 million (5.89 months of import cover) as at September 9. This meets the CBK's statutory requirement to endeavor to maintain at least 4 months of import cover, and the EAC region's convergence criteria of 4.5 months of import cover (Table 4).

Money Market

The money market was liquid during the week ending September 9, supported by government payments, which offset tax remittances. Commercial banks' excess reserves stood at KSh 10.2 billion in relation to the 4.25 percent cash reserves requirement (CRR). Open market operations remained active. The average interbank rate was 3.62 percent on September 9 compared to 3.28 percent on September 2. During the week, the average number of interbank deals per day increased to 32 from 21 in the previous week, while the average value traded increased to KSh 12.6 billion from KSh 10.7 billion (Table 5).

Government Securities Market

The Treasury bills auctions of September 9, received bids totalling KSh 17.4 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 24.0 billion, representing a performance of 72.6 percent. Interest rates on the Treasury bills remained stable, with the 91-day, 182-day and 364-day rates increasing marginally **(Table 6).**

During the September 8, Treasury Bond auction, the twenty-one-year infrastructure Treasury bonds issued received bids totalling KSh 151.3 billion against an advertised amount of KSh 75.0 billion, representing a performance rate of 201.7 percent (**Table 7**).

Equity Market

At the Nairobi Securities Exchange, the NSE 20 share index and total shares traded improved by 1.9 percent and 28.5 percent, respectively. However, the NSE 25 and NASI share indices, equity turnover and market capitalization declined by 0.8 percent, 0.6 percent, 1.6 percent, and 0.6 percent respectively, during the week ending September 9 (**Table 8**).

Bonds Market

Turnover of bonds in the domestic secondary market declined by 15.2 percent during the week ending September 9 (**Table 8**). In the international market, yields on Kenya's Eurobonds increased by an average of 12.9 basis points. Similarly, yields on the 10-year Eurobonds for Angola and Ghana also increased (**Chart 2**).

Global Trends

Global financial markets sentiment remained cautious during the week ending September 9, after several major financial institutions expressed concerns over the slow growth momentum attributed to the resurgence of COVID-19 infections.

International oil prices increased during the week ending September 9, following Hurricane Ida disruptions which limited crude oil production and refining activity off the US Gulf Coast. Murban oil price increased to USD 71.4 per barrel on September 9 compared with USD 70.48 per barrel on September 2.

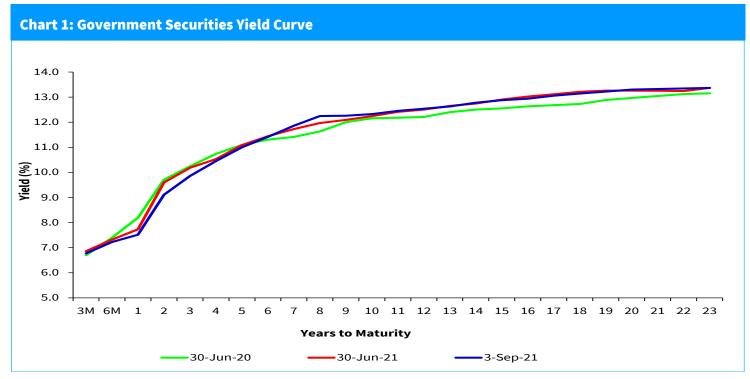

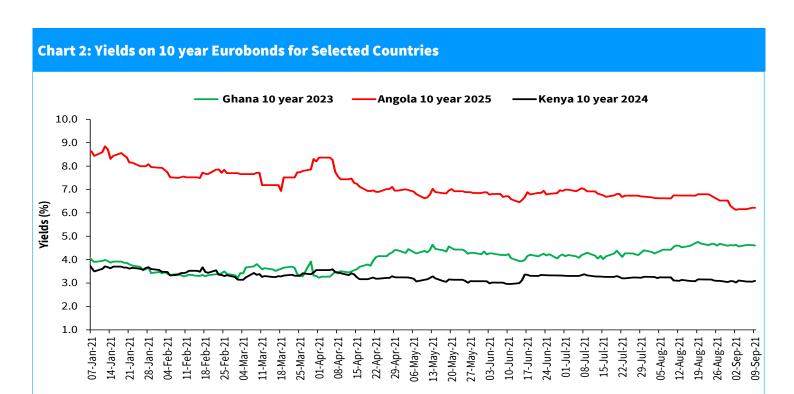
